

What are the aims and intentions of this curriculum?

The aim of our Key Stage 4 Curriculum is to ensure students' develop an understanding of health and safety in the Hair Beauty industry. Students will further explore the chemistry of hair and beauty products, including the products and their effects on the skin and hair. Learners will develop knowledge of skin and hair anatomy, as well as the characteristics of, and factors affecting, different hair and skin types. Students will also be introduced to the hair and beauty sector, which is the examination unit assessed externally in year 11.
