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Invaluable Sessions for Year 11

The National Citizen Service (NCS) have been visiting Parkside every Thursday as part of a five week programme to deliver invaluable sessions to our Year 11 students through experiential learning. On Thursday 10th March, students engaged in a range of teambuilding activities, as well as some basic first aid. They were split into two groups, and each group was given activities that required both verbal and non-verbal communication, teamwork, perseverance and critical thinking.



Team A worked together, strategising to move beanbags around the room without touching them. Team B learnt basic first aid, putting each other in the recovery position, and used manikins to demonstrate what they would do in the event that someone had a cardiac arrest. They also learned how to administer medication using a trainer EpiPen to someone if they were having an anaphylactic shock.







The students worked diligently and sensibly and were mindful of how serious the situation can be if it were to happen in reality.

College Closure


Please note that from Monday 28th March through to Friday 1st April the College will be closed for our half term holiday. College reopens at the normal time on Monday 4th April.

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College Drop off and Collection

Attendance

We would like to remind parents, guardians and carers that research shows there is a clear link between the attendance rate of students and their level of attainment. Please support your child to attend regularly by ensuring that any medical or other appointments are organised out of college hours. The expectation of the governing body is that all students will achieve a minimum annual attendance rate of 96%. The only circumstances in which absence from college will be authorised are when your child is too ill to attend or permission for leave of absence, due to exceptional circumstances, has been received from the Principal.

E-Safety

The internet is an amazing resource, which enables students to connect, communicate and be creative in a number of different ways on a range of devices. However, students need constant advice and protection when it comes to managing their time online. They need strict guidance to positively and safely access information on the internet, communicate via social networks, use applications and play games. At college, students' online activity is monitored very closely and strict software security programmes are installed to prevent students accessing inappropriate content. We advise parents, guardians and carers to reinforce the important message of staying safe online when they are at home. Please ensure your children understand the rules you put in place to keep them safe. Talk to them on a regular basis about what they are looking at online and ensure that you install appropriate software to support and manage your child's safe use of the internet. Free School Meals (FSM) Entitlement

'Free School Meals' is a statutory means-tested benefit, which provides a child with meals at school or college for free. If you believe you may be entitled to this benefit for your child, please attend the College reception and request an application form. The member of staff on reception will be able to advise any parents, guardians or carers who are unfamiliar with the process for claiming 'Free School Meals'. Please note that parents, guardians and carers must reapply each year for this benefit.

Visitor Access

While the staff and Governing Body wish to facilitate access to the College for parents, guardians, carers and other visitors, they also have a duty of care and responsibility for the safety of students. Therefore, on arrival, all visitors are requested to enter the College via the main entrance only on and report to the reception. Visitors must not enter the campus via any other entrance.
